Voter rolls in Arizona up sharply

One of the few things growing faster than Arizona's population is the number of registered voters.

The state is now home to more than 2.6 million voters, a 4.7 percent increase since 2004, according to recent figures from the Secretary of State's Office.

Arizona was the second-fastest-growing state in the country after Nevada from 2004 to 2005, when its population jumped 3.5 percent to 5.9 million.

Election officials attribute much of the growth in voter numbers to registration drives mounted by political parties and interest groups in anticipation of last year's presidential race.

"In 2004, we processed 261,400 voter registration forms," said Chris Roads, Pima County deputy recorder and registrar of voters. "This year we processed 45,860. It's been much quieter."

Roads predicted a flurry of forms will be filed next year — by new voters as well as those who move or change their names — because of the gubernatorial, congressional and state legislative contests.

The new voter registration figures show that Arizona is home to 1,063,112 Republicans, 913,418 Democrats, 668,352 independents and 18,476 Libertarians.

But while Republicans are the dominant force in Maricopa County, Demo-crats outnumber Republicans in 10 of the state's 15 counties. Among them is Pima County, where there are 180,328 Democrats, 150,876 Republicans, 124,180 independents and 3,841 Libertarians.

With 459,225 registered voters, Pima County has slightly more than 17 percent of Arizona citizens eligible to vote in local, state and federal elections.

Over the past year, the ranks of Pima County's voters grew from 448,050, an increase of 2.5 percent. But it has surged by more than 23 percent since 2000, when the county had 371,696 voters.

Maricopa County, home to about 60 percent of the state's population, has about the same percentage of voters. With 682,787 Republicans, it has more GOP voters than all other counties combined.
